


What does this mean for our beneficiaries today?

- There are no changes for clients yet. There are no reductions or changes to services MaineCare covers.
- There are no immediate changes to MaineCare eligibility. Automatic Renewals (Passive Renewals) will still happen.
- The earliest changes will start in Fall 2026.

MaineCare Work or Community Engagement Requirements



January 2027

Who does this apply to?

This applies to Medicaid Expansion members who newly apply, or upon existing renewal dates, beginning January 1, 2027

What is the requirement?

Members must document 80 hours/month of work, volunteering, or be enrolled in at least a half-time educational program, or meet specific exclusion criteria.



Exclusion Criteria for MaineCare Work or Community Engagement Requirements

Members who do not meet requirements or exclusion cannot receive subsidies through CoverME. Exclusion criteria encompasses a broad range of categories including people

who are:

Pregnant

Parents or caregivers of a dependent under age 14 or who has a disability

Tribal members and Alaska Natives

Veterans with service connected disabilities

Have Substance Use Disorder (SUD)/ receiving defined SUD treatment

Medically frail or otherwise have special medical needs

Former foster youth under age 26

Currently incarcerated or have been released within the past 90 days

Family caregivers as defined in RAISE Family Caregivers Act

Compliant with TANF/SNAP work requirements



MaineCare Work or Community Engagement Requirements – Added Details

Required Outreach

 Starting by at least October 1, 2026 (3 months before implementation)

Existing Data Sources

 States must use data they have access to for ex parte process to meet CE requirement or exclusion criteria

Limited Funding


 There is limited funding available for states to implement.

Good Faith Waiver

- States may apply to extend the implementation deadline.
- We are assessing.

Eligibility Changes for Immigrant Groups




October 2026

Eliminates federal coverage for certain immigrant groups such as refugees, asylees, trafficking survivors, and certain parolees.

- Still eligible for Emergency Services coverage with a reduced federal match rate for this type of coverage for certain populations.
- Excludes children and pregnant people





Broader Impacts



Language for clients, beneficiaries, and partners

Changes often require rule making which can take time: The Department will notify the public of the expected implementation date of these changes and more information through a notice of proposed rulemaking.


The Department must always notify clients of changes to their eligibility: Impacted individuals will receive a notice the month prior to any decrease in benefits.

Rural Health Transformation Program (RHTP)

- Created by H.R. 1 (July 2025)
 - Maine projected to lose ~\$5B in federal health funding over 10 years
 - Rural health providers at risk; higher costs, more uninsured
 - Federal initiative to bolster rural health
- \$50B, time-limited funding (2026–2030)
 - Distributed by the U.S. Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) to states with approved applications
- Distribution two allocations
 - \$25B allocated evenly across all 50 states
 - ~\$100M/year for the next 5 years for Maine
 - Plan must be approved by CMS to access funds
 - \$25B allocated to a subset of at least 14 states at CMS' discretion
- There will be no "No-Cost Extensions"
 - Unused funds within specified time limits will be redistributed to other states
